

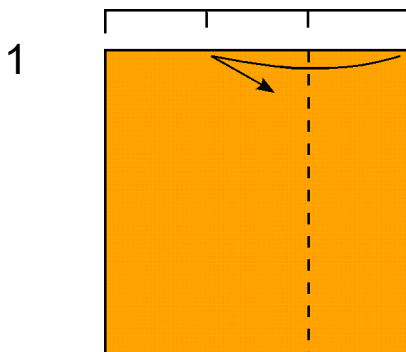
An Elephant in the Room

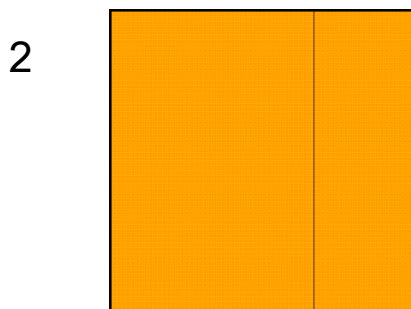
This see-through double image design is a combination of my Hotel Room and Elephants Extreme designs. The elephant only becomes visible when the design is held up to the light.

You will need a single square of light coloured, fairly translucent, paper.

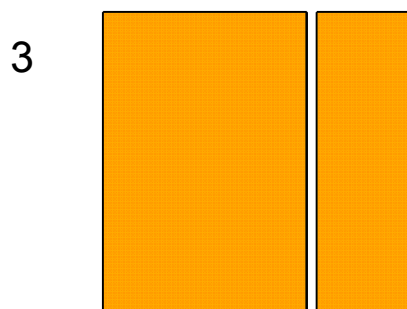
Begin folding with your paper arranged coloured side up.



1. Fold the left edge inwards so that the crease forms one third of the way across the paper. See the free Water Trade download [Folding the 3x3 Grid](#) for several ways to do this.

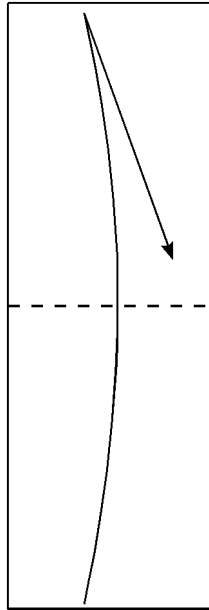


2. Cut carefully along the vertical crease to separate the two parts of the paper.



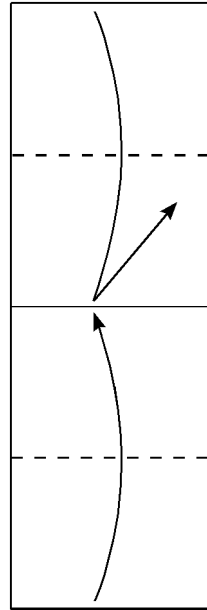
3. Only the right hand section is required. This section is a 3x1 rectangle.

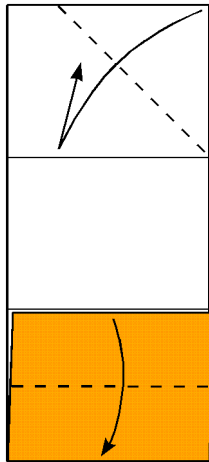
4. Fold in half upwards, then unfold.

5. Fold the top and bottom edges to the centre. Unfold the top fold only.

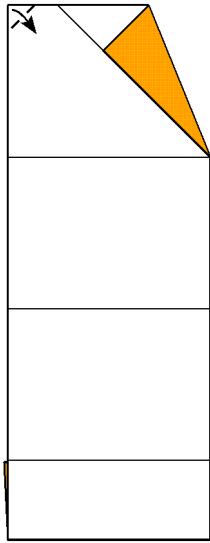
6. Fold the front flap in half downwards. Fold the top right corner inwards using the crease made in step 4 as a guide, then unfold.

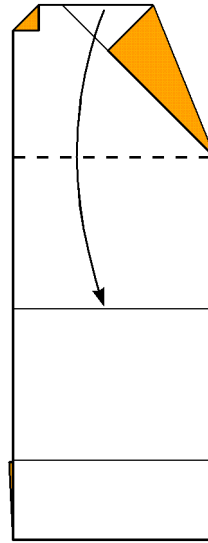
7. Fold the top right corner inwards as shown.

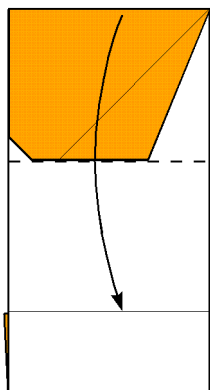
8. Fold the top left corner inwards as shown.

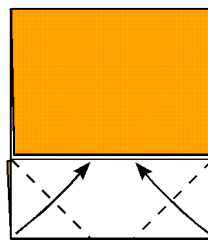
9. Fold the top section of the paper downwards using the existing crease.

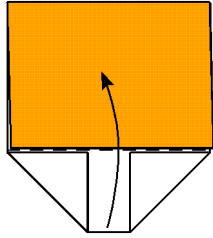
10. Fold the top of the paper downwards again using the existing crease.

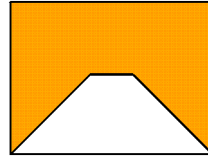
11. Fold both the bottom corners inwards to lie along the folded edge.

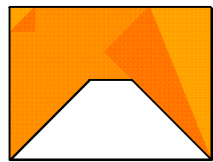
12. Fold the bottom of the paper upwards using the existing crease.
