

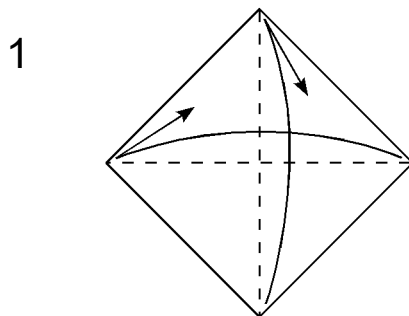
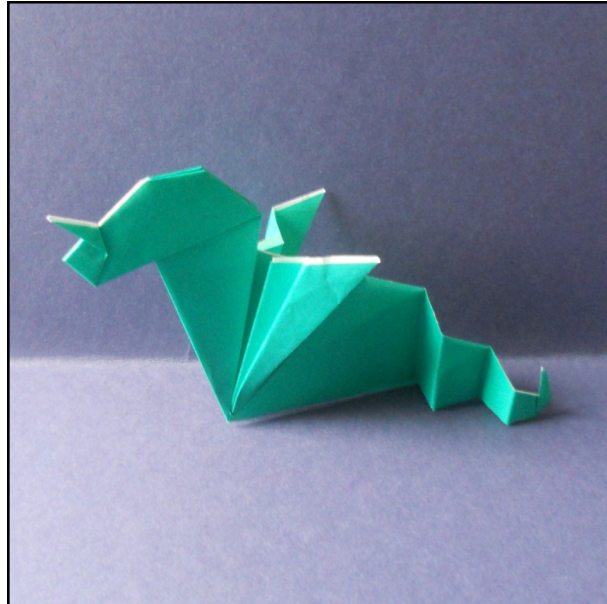
# Baby Dragon

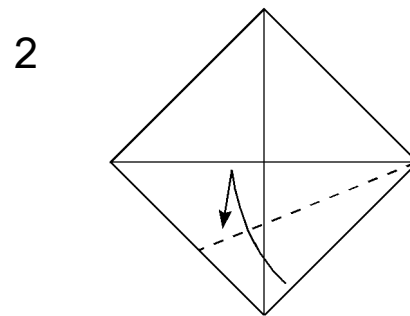
Baby Dragon is a design from 2013.

The photo shows a Baby Dragon folded from irogami. I quite like the white edges to the wings and head but you could get rid of them by using dyed paper instead.

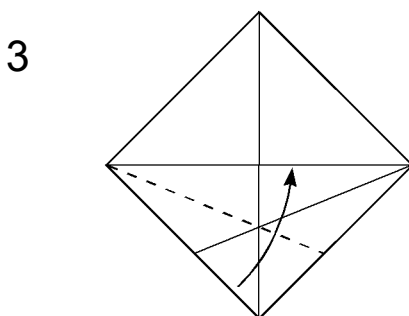
If you are using irogami begin folding with your paper arranged white side up.



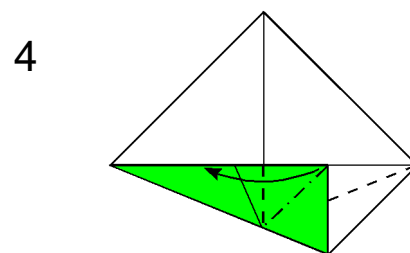
1. Fold diagonally in half both ways then unfold.



2. Fold the bottom right sloping edge onto the horizontal crease, then unfold.

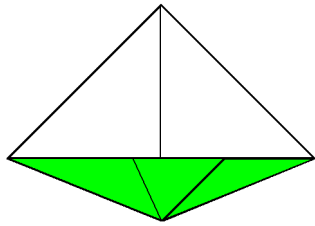


3. Fold the bottom left sloping edge onto the horizontal crease.



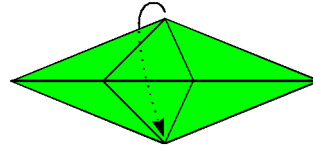
4. Fold the top right corner of the front layer across to the left so that the paper collapses into the shape shown in picture 5.

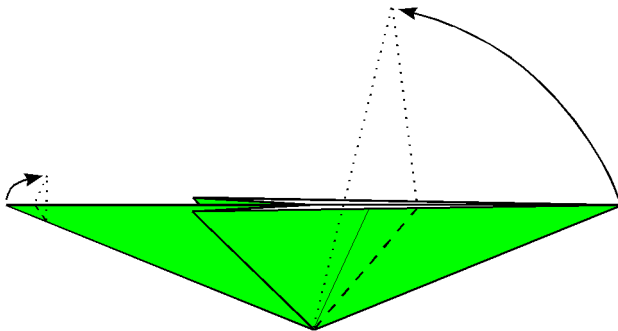
5. Repeat steps 2 through 4 on the top half of the paper.

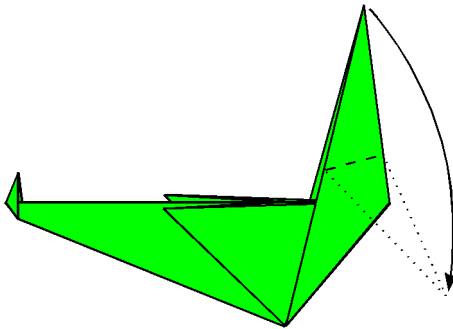
6. This is what the result should look like. Fold in half backwards.

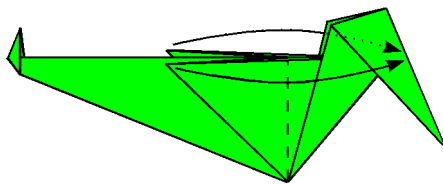
7. Fold the right point upwards outside the other layers to the position marked by the dotted line. Fold the tip of the left point upwards outside the other layers in a similar way.

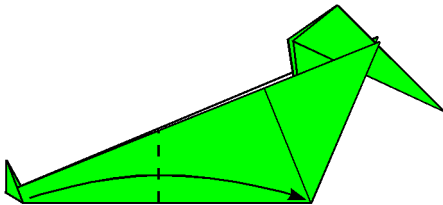
8. Fold the top right point downwards outside the other layers as shown.

9. Fold both wings across to the right like this. The next picture has been rotated slightly.

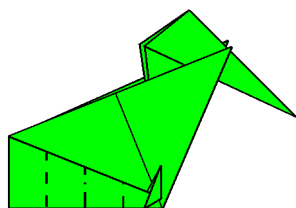


10. Fold the tail across to the right like this.

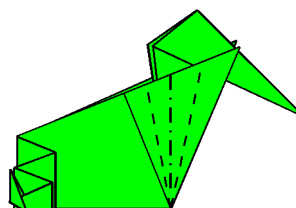

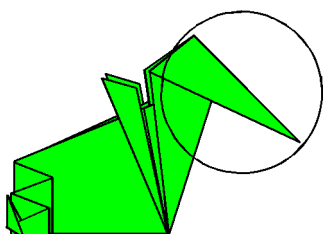
11. Zigzag pleat the tail so that it looks like picture 12.

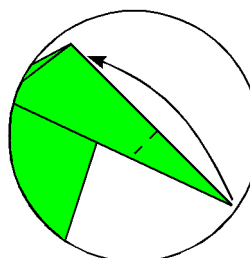
12. Pleat both wings like fans.

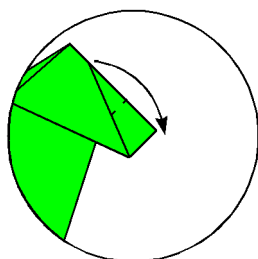
13. The result should look like this. The next picture is on a larger scale.

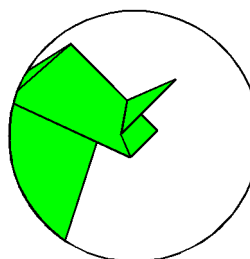
14. Fold the point of the head diagonally upwards outside the other layers.

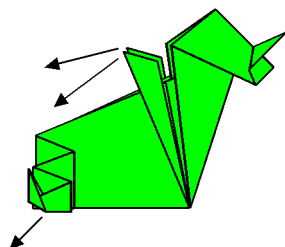
15. Fold the tip of the front layer diagonally downwards again to form the horn.

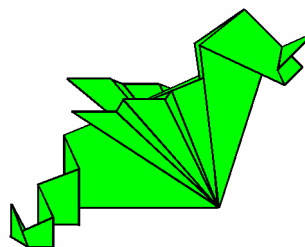
16. Pull the horn upwards so that it looks like this.

17. Open out the pleats of the tail at right angles. Also open out the folds of the wings.
