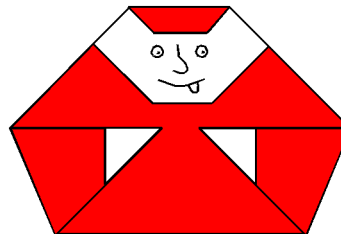


Cardinal Sin

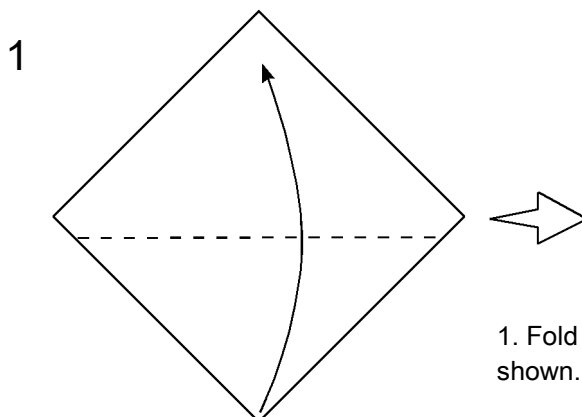

Cardinal Sin is one of a series of Origamidadas that I designed in 2002 at the request of my late friend Dorothy Englemann. It was originally published on her Origami Swami website under the pseudonym of Oliver Zachary. I subsequently recycled the design, but without the pun, as Man in a Cap in my book Kid-O-Gami.

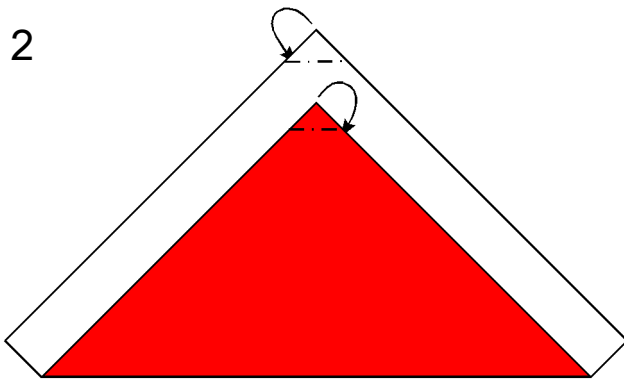


If you are interested in Origamidada you will find a link to a page devoted to this type of origami on the SAMS (Single and Multiple Sheet Designs) page of my Origami Heaven website. David Brill has characterised this style of design, where details are drawn on rather than imagined or folded, as birogami, and that, of course, is the cardinal sin of the title.

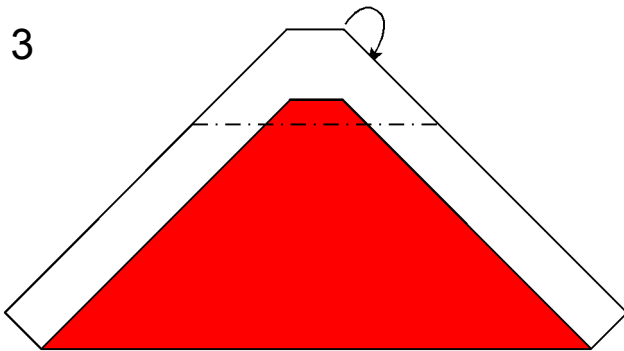
You will need a single square of paper. Cardinal Sin is best made from a red or purple irogami. Begin with your paper arranged white side up.



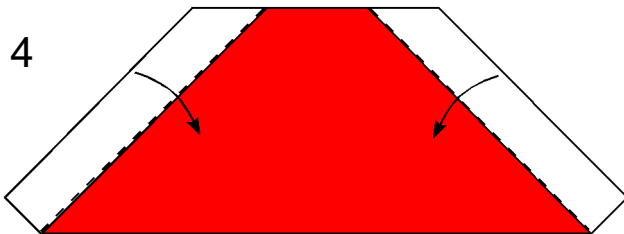
1. Fold the bottom point upwards as shown.



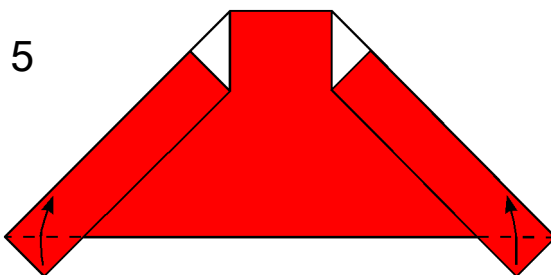
2. Fold the top of both layers backwards separately as shown.



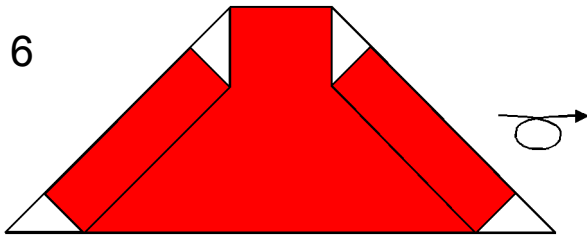
3. Fold the top of both layers backwards together as shown.



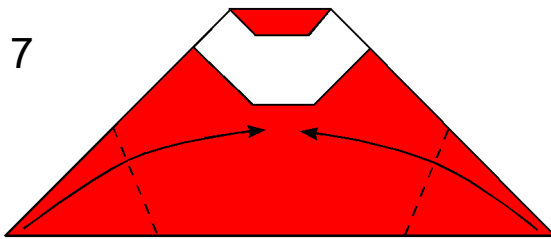
4. Fold both upper sloping edges inwards along the line of the edges of the paper in front of them.



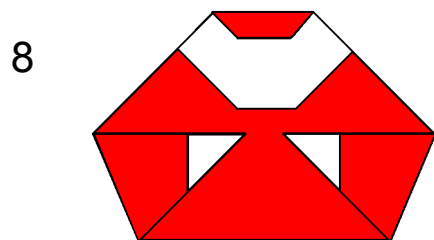
5. Form the hands by folding both the bottom corners upwards along the line of the edge behind them.



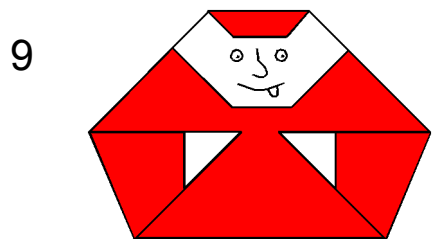
6. Turn over sideways.



7. Fold both outside corners inwards as shown.



8. Complete Cardinal Sin by drawing on a lascivious face.



9. Cardinal Sin is finished.
