

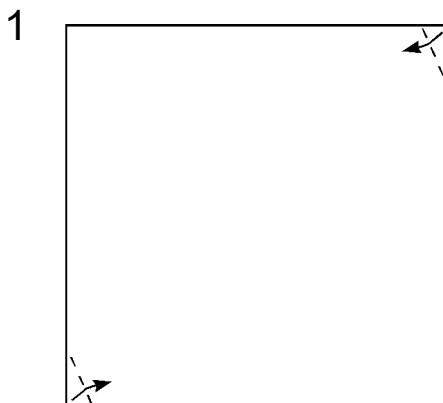
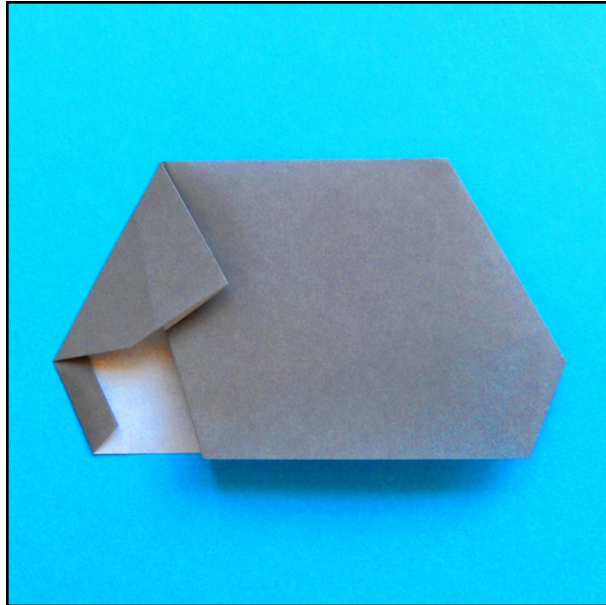
Mumbo Jumbo

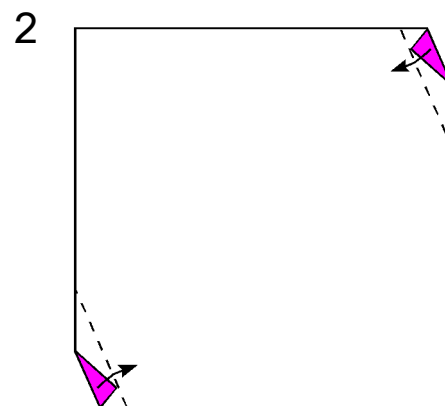
Mumbo Jumbo is a pictorial double image design. Although simple in conception, it is not as straightforward to fold as it as first appears, since almost all the folds are unlocated and must be as judgement folds.

Mumbo Jumbo was designed in 2010.

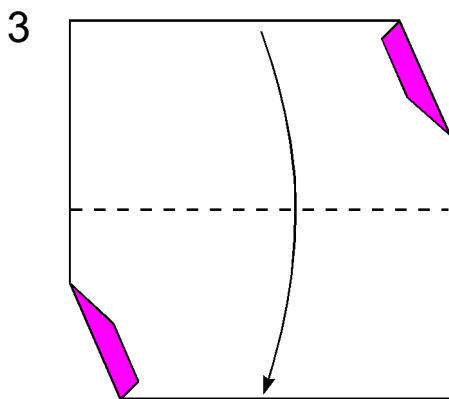
You will need a single square of irogami in a suitable elephantine colour. Begin with your paper arranged white side up.



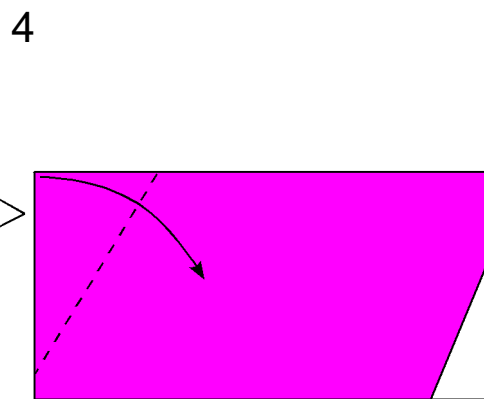
1. Make tiny folds in two opposite corners like this.



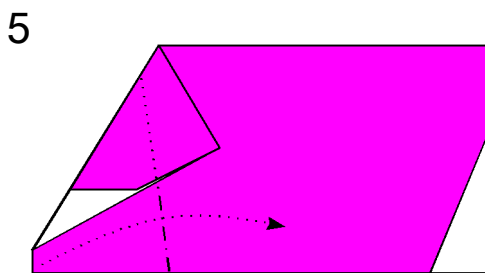
2. Fold both corners inwards again.



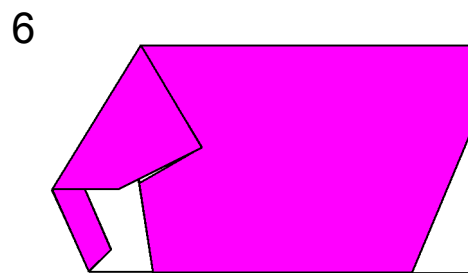
3. Fold in half downwards.



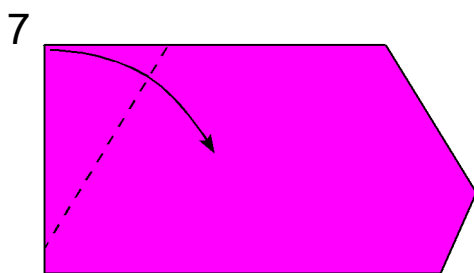
4. Fold the top left hand corner inwards.
Note that the crease does not pass



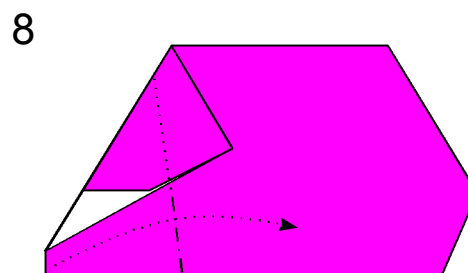
5. Fold the front layers of the bottom left hand corner backwards in between the



6. This is what the result should look like. Turn over sideways.

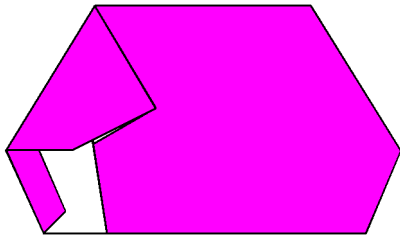


7. Repeat step 4 on the new top left hand corner.



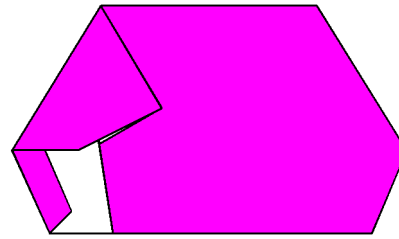
8. Repeat step 5 as well.
