

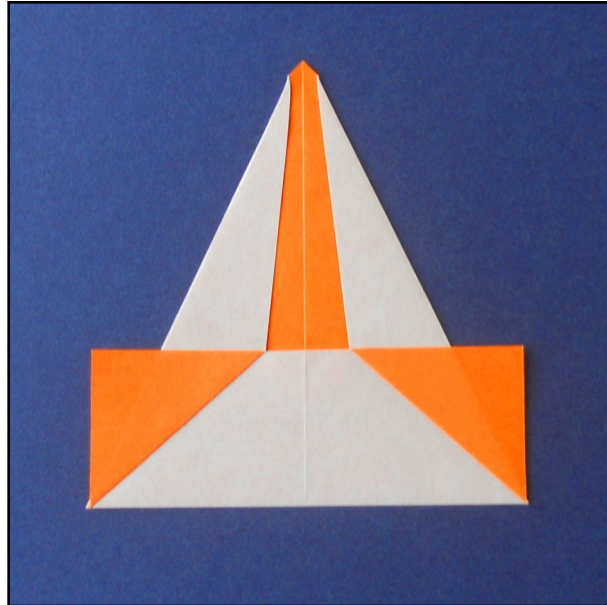
Obelisk

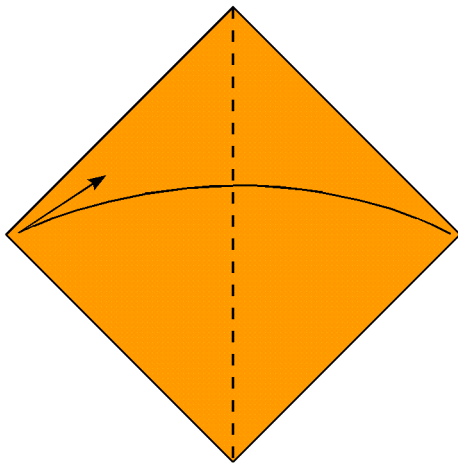
Obelisk is a minimalist landscape design that requires six active folds.

Obelisk was designed in 2000.

You will need a single square of irogami. Begin with your paper arranged coloured side up.

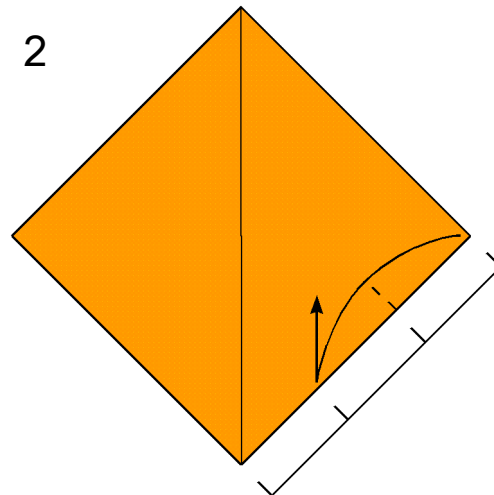

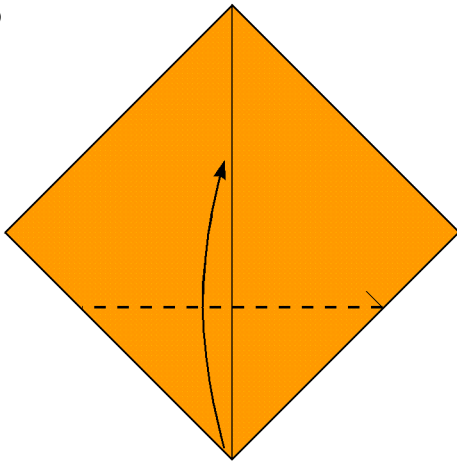
1. Fold in half sideways, then unfold.

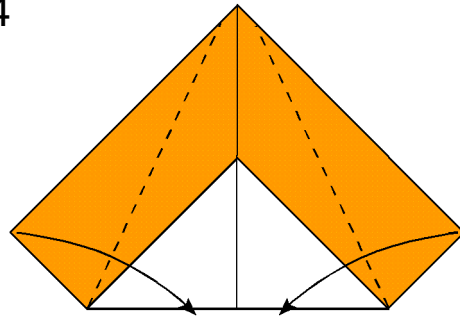
2. Make a tiny crease one third of the way down the sloping right hand edge. You can either do this accurately using the method given on pages 74 and 75 or approximate it by eye. A small inaccuracy will not matter here.

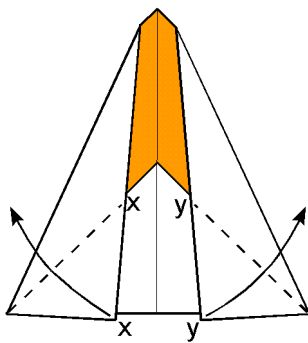
3. Use the tiny crease made in step 2 to locate this fold.

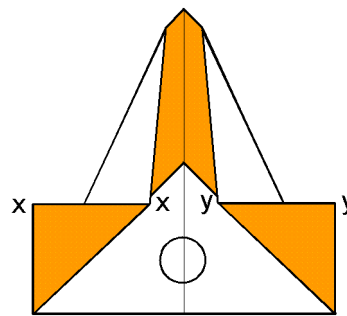
4. Fold both outside corners inwards as shown. Note that these creases do not quite reach the top corner. It is important to get the sketch evenly balanced at this stage.

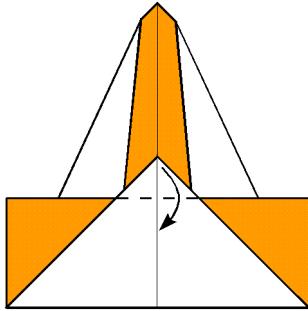
5. Fold the inside bottom corners of the top layers outwards. It is important that the edge xx and yy end up parallel to the bottom edge of the design.

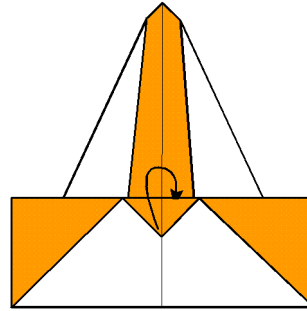
6. Rearrange the layers to bring the internal flap marked with a circle to the front.

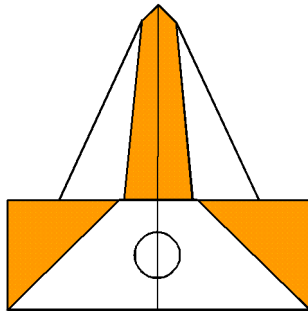
7. Fold the tip of the top flap downwards along the line of the top edges of the layers behind.

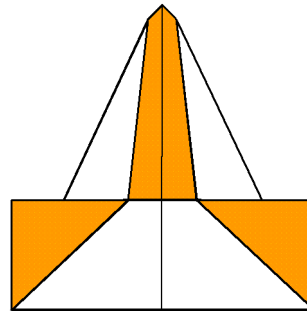
8. Swing this new flap backwards out of sight using the existing crease.

9. Tuck the sloping edges of the front flap marked with a circle underneath the layers immediately behind them.

10. Obelisk is finished.

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
