

# Old Man with Stick/Staff

Designed by David Mitchell

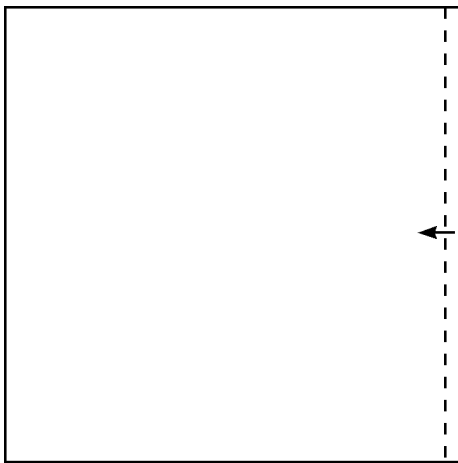
Old Man with Stick is a very simple design that is made using just six active folds. It can quickly be transformed into Old Man with Staff, by means of a single cut.

Old Man with Stick was designed in 2006.

You will need a single square of irogami. Begin with your paper arranged white side up.

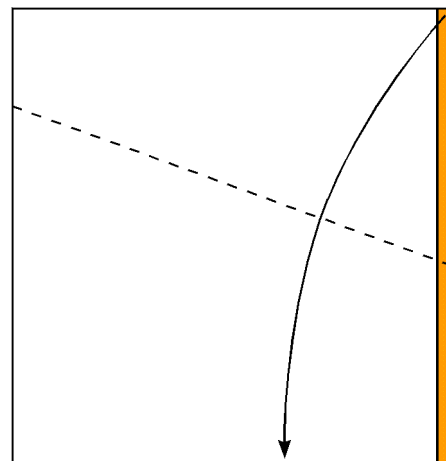

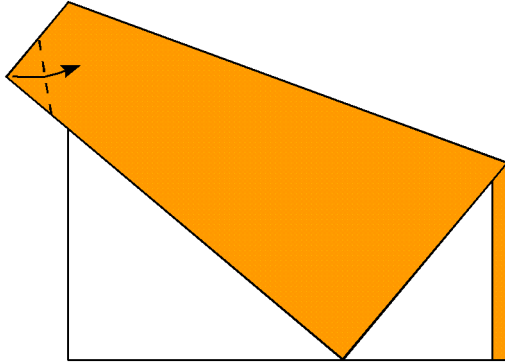
1. Fold the right hand edge inwards by a tiny amount.

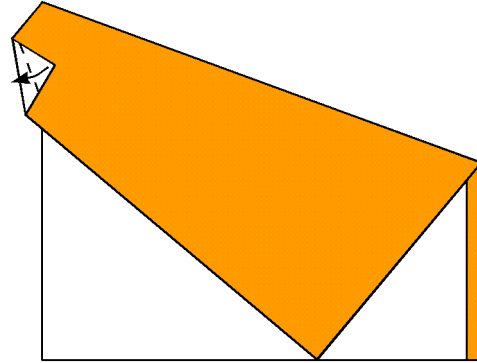
2. Fold the top right hand corner onto the bottom edge so that the result looks like

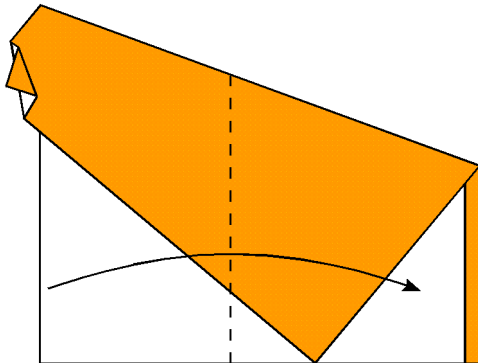
3. Fold the left hand point of the top layer inwards as shown.

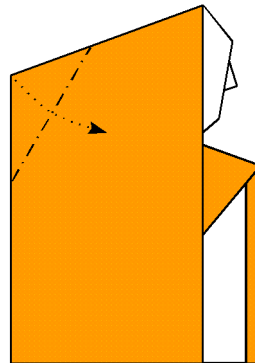
4. Fold the same point outwards again. Check the result against picture 5 and adjust if necessary.

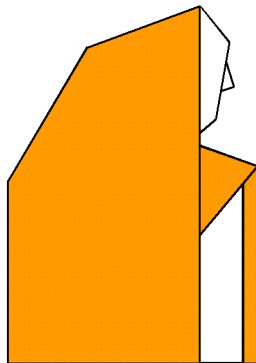
5. Fold in half sideways as shown.

6. Fold the top left hand corner backwards out of sight.

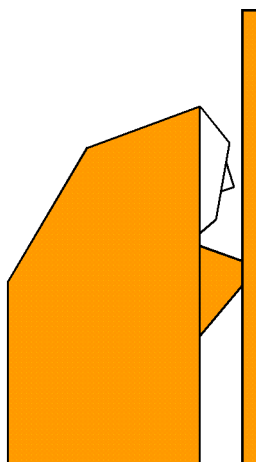

7. The Old Man with Stick is finished.

8. If your origami ethics allow you to use cuts you may like to transform the Old Man with Stick into the Old Man with Staff. Just a single straight cut is required. A more complicated cut can transform the staff to a crozier or crook.
