

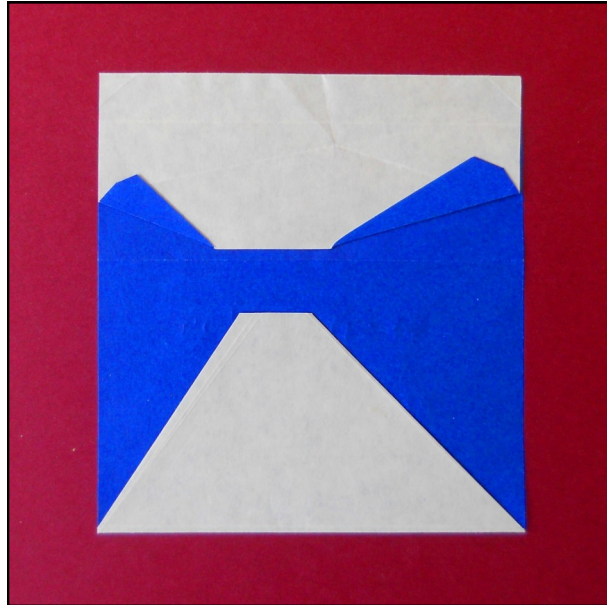
Harbour at Skiathos

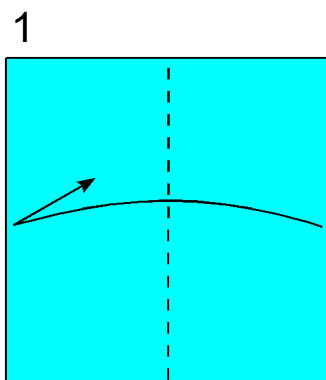
Harbour at Skiathos is one of a series of pictorial landscapes. If you go to Skiathos Town you will be able to identify the place I was sitting when I first folded this design.

Harbour at Skiathos was designed in 1999.

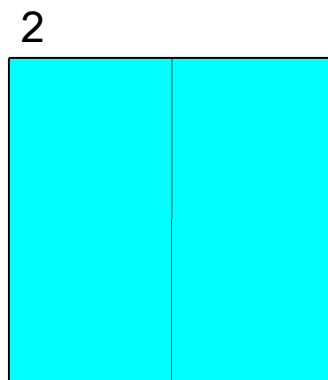
You will need a single square of irogami in a suitable dark colour.



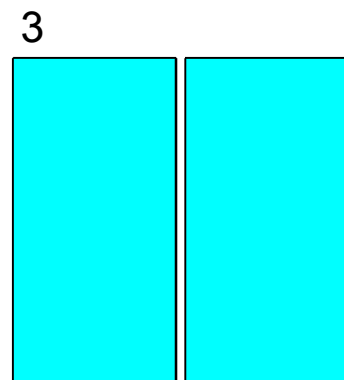
Begin with your paper arranged coloured side up.



1. Fold in half sideways, then unfold.

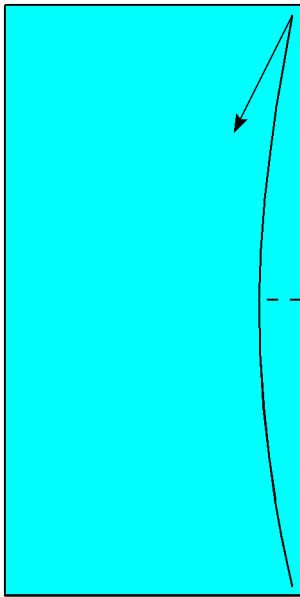


2. Separate the two halves of the paper by cutting along the crease.



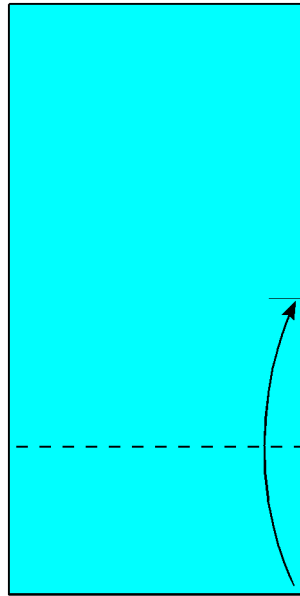
3. Only one half is needed.

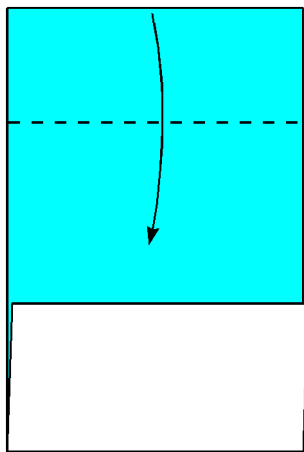
4. Make a tiny crease to mark the centre of the right hand edge.

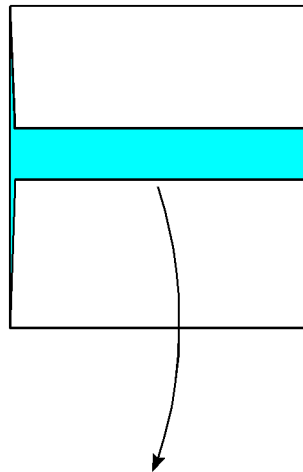
5. Fold the bottom edge upwards.

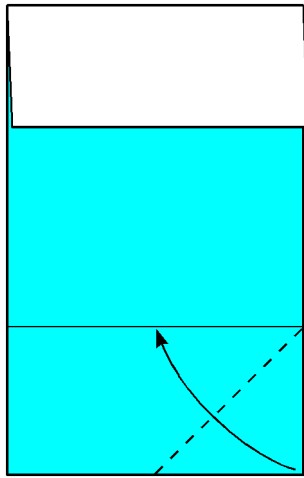
6. Fold the top edge downwards leaving a gap between the two edges. This gap will become the sea.

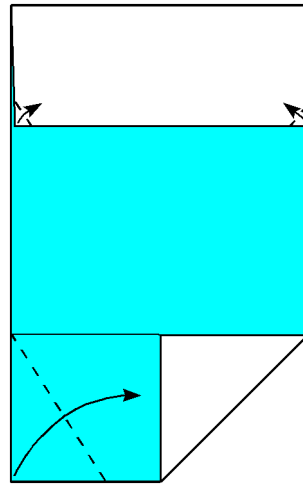
7. Open out the bottom flap.

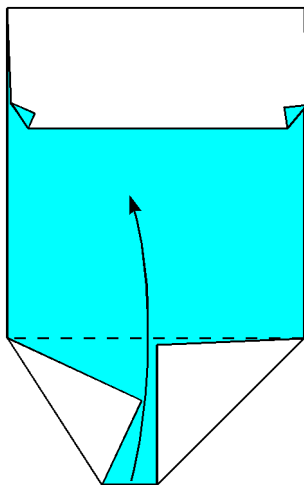
8. Fold the bottom right hand corner inwards, like this.

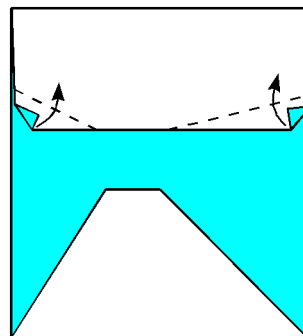
9. Fold the bottom corners of the top front flap inwards. These folds are really tiny! Then fold the bottom left hand corner inwards as well.

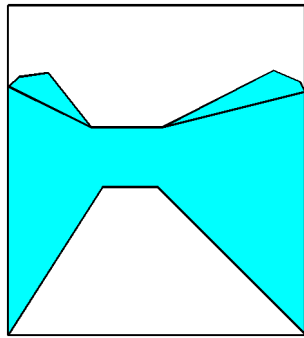
10. This is what the result should look like. Fold the bottom part of the paper upwards again using the existing crease.

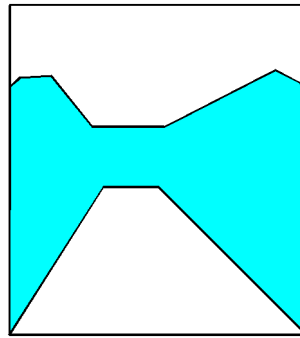
11. Fold the bottom corners of the top flap upwards again to form the islands. The harbour mouth that lies between them should be just about the same width as the end of the jetty.

12. Harbour at Skiathos is finished.

13. If you have used dark enough paper the islands and the sea should blend into each other in silhouette.
