


Guinea Pig

Guinea Pig is a very simple design which can be folded from a single square of irogami of a suitable colour.

Begin with your paper coloured side up.




1. Fold in half from top to bottom.


2. Open out the fold made in step 1.




3. Fold both the left hand corners inwards to lie along the horizontal crease.








4. Make these two tiny folds so that the flaps they form are the same size and as similar in shape as possible. Picture 5 shows what the result should look like.

5. Turn over sideways.










6. Fold in half from top to bottom by reversing the crease made in step 1. The next picture has been drawn to a larger scale.

7. Begin forming the head and the tail by making these two small folds. Crease firmly. Picture 8 shows what the result should look like.








8. Open out both the folds made in step 7.

9. Turn the head and the tail inside out between the layers of the body using the creases made in step 7.




10. Guinea Pig is finished.

Simple Sheep


Guinea Pig is such a generic design that if you make it from white or black homogeneous paper, or even from black/white irogami, instead it can serve as a Simple Sheep.




11. If you begin with paper that is white on both sides you will end up with a Simple Sheep that looks like this.

12. If you use black/white irogami and begin white side up your sheep will end up with a black face like this.
