

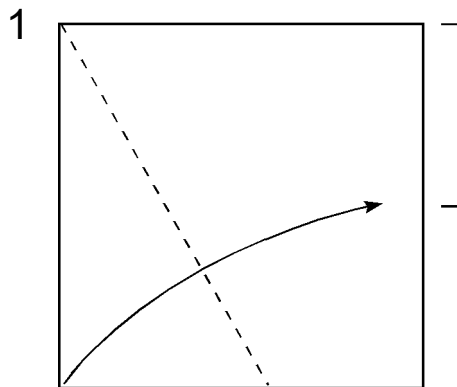
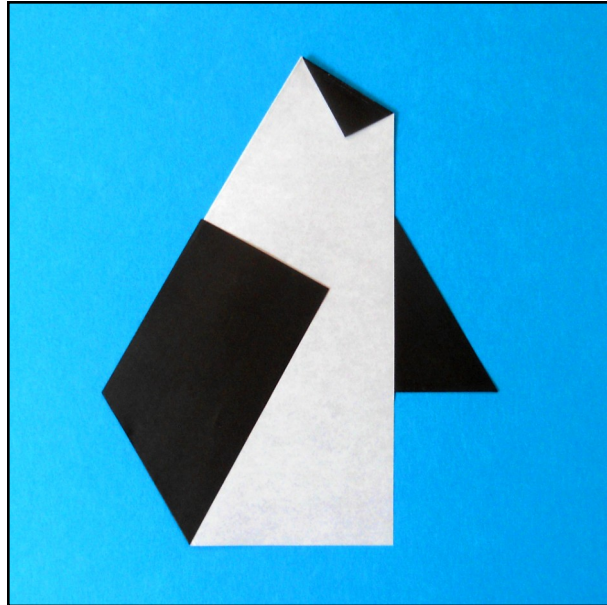
# Penguin

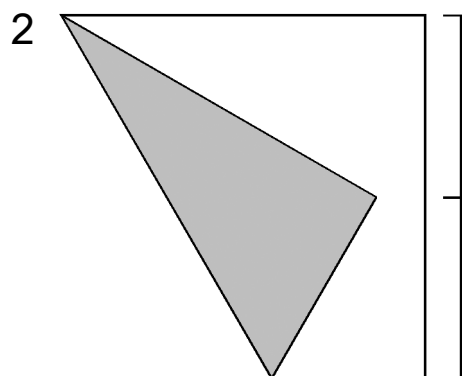
Penguin is a minimalist design that is made using just three active folds.

Penguin was designed in 2008.

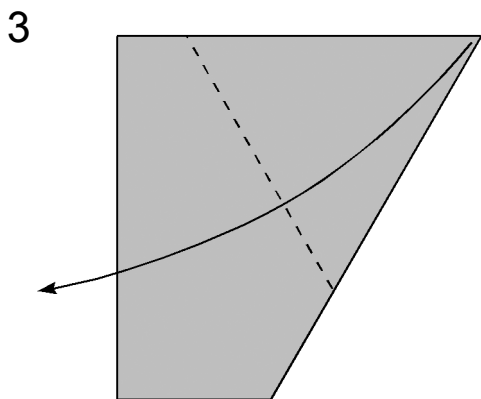
You will need a single square of irogami, white / black for preference, though purple or orange penguins may also possibly exist. Begin with your paper arranged white side up.



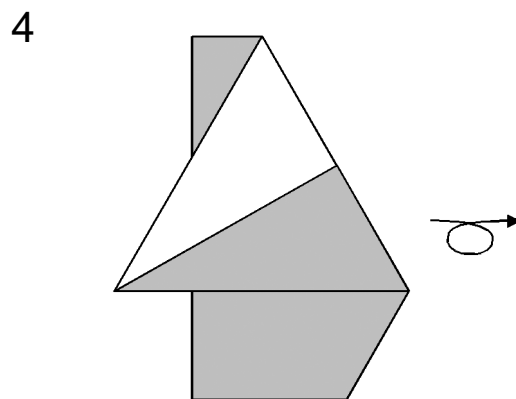
1. Fold the bottom left hand corner inwards so that the corner ends up on an imaginary crease half way up the square. The crease must intersect the top left hand corner, which remains sharp.



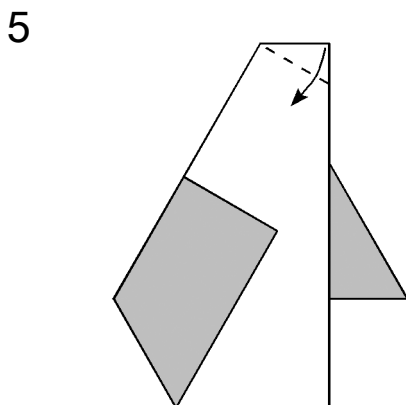
2. The result should look like this. Turn over sideways.



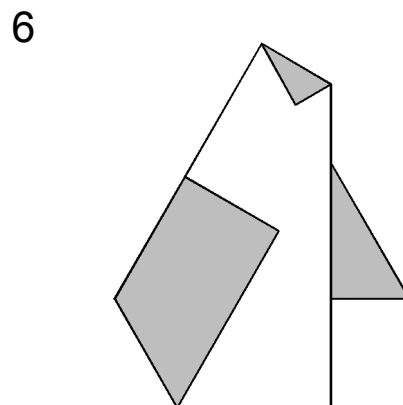
3. Fold the top right hand corner across to the left so that the sketch looks like picture 4. There are no location points for this fold.



4. Make sure that the bottom edge of the new top layers is parallel to the bottom edge of the sketch. Adjust if necessary then turn over sideways.



5. Fold the top right hand corner inwards as shown.



6. Penguin is finished in just three folds.
