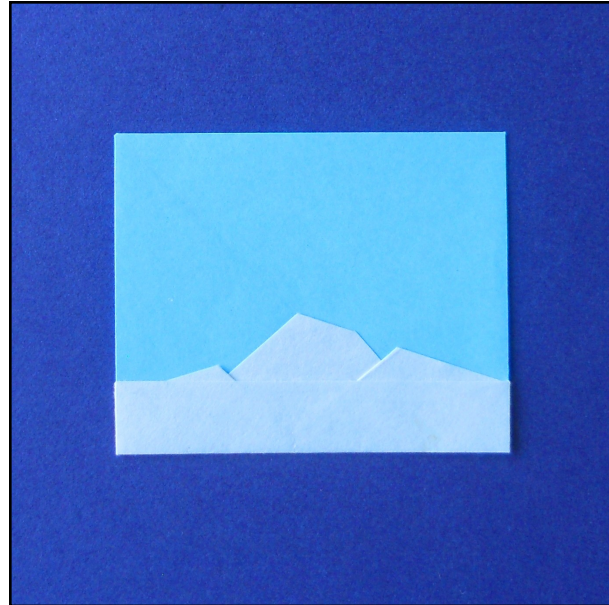

South is one of a series of pictorial landscapes.

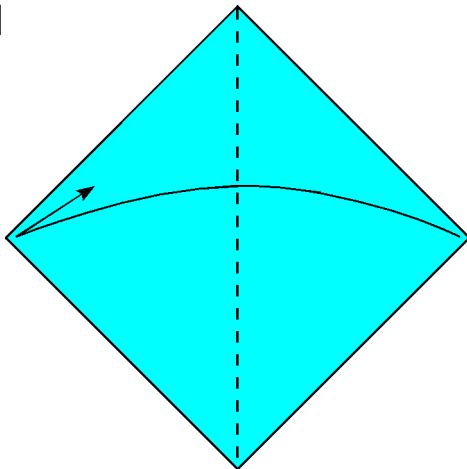
South was designed in 1993.

You will need a single square of irogami, blue / white for preference.

Begin with your paper arranged coloured side up.

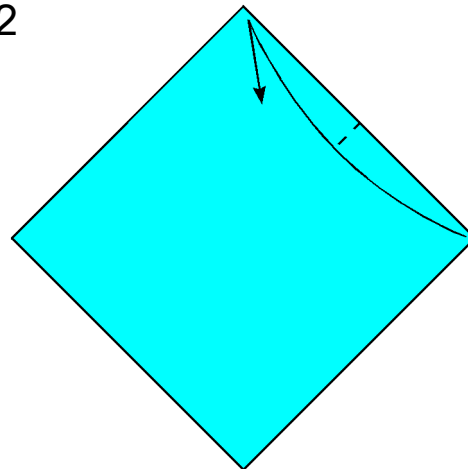

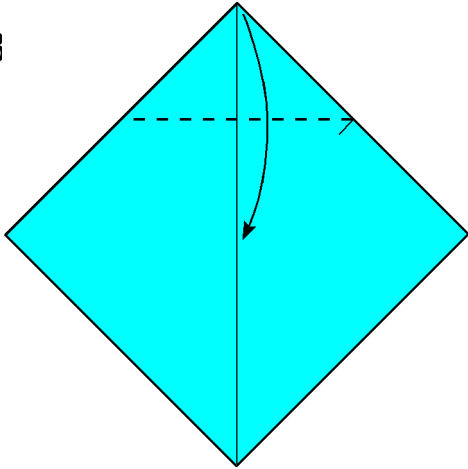
1. Fold in half sideways, then unfold.

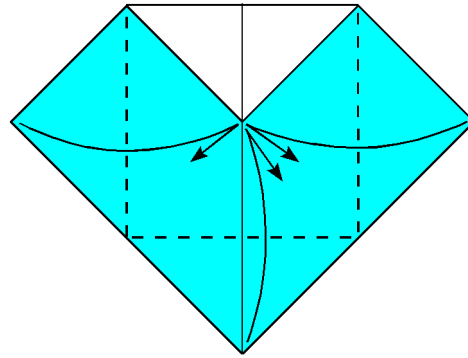
2. Make a tiny crease to mark the centre of the sloping edge.

3



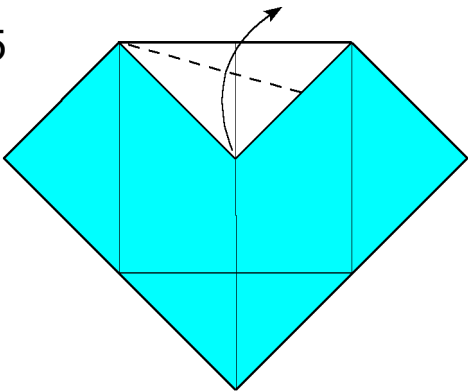
3. Fold the top point downwards using the crease made in step 2 to position the fold.

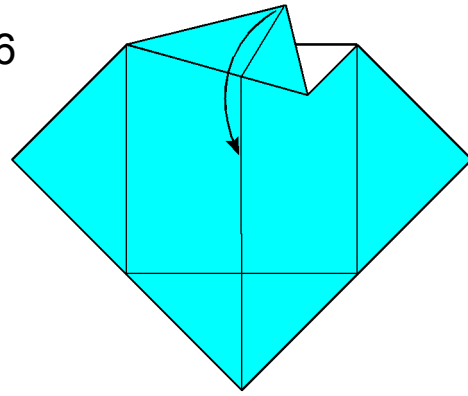
4. Fold the three other corners into the centre, then unfold.

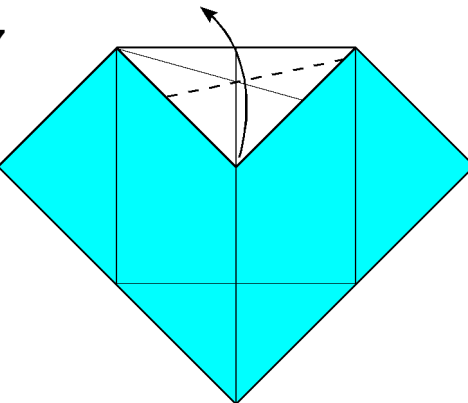
5. Fold the point of the white triangle upwards so that your paper looks like picture 6.

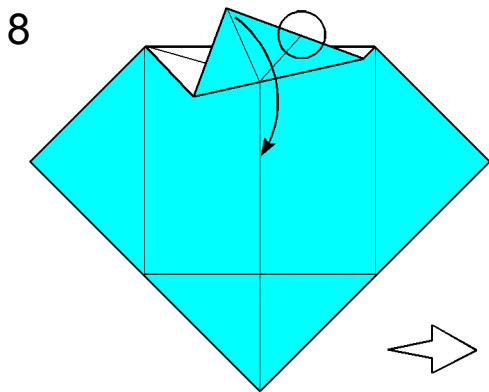
6. Open out the fold made in step 5.

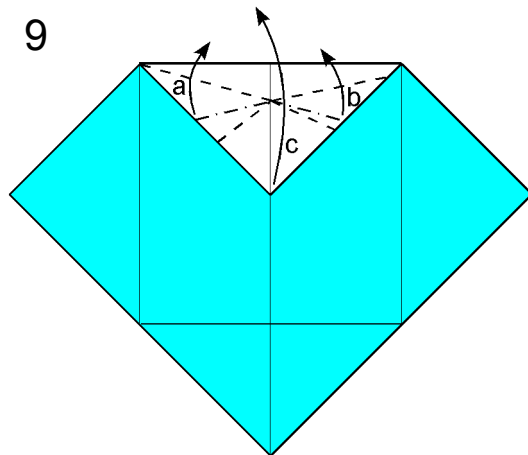


7. Fold the corner of the white triangle upwards to the right as shown. Note that the resulting crease does not pass through the top right hand corner.

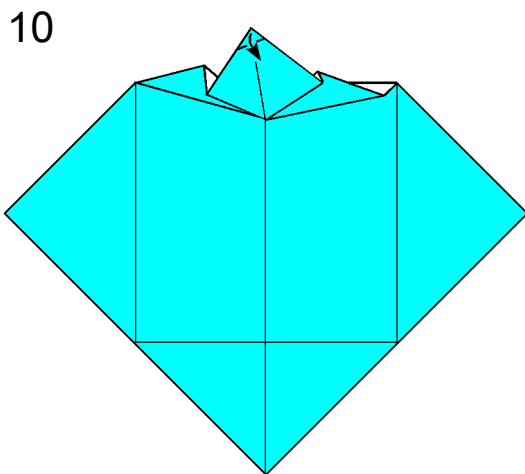

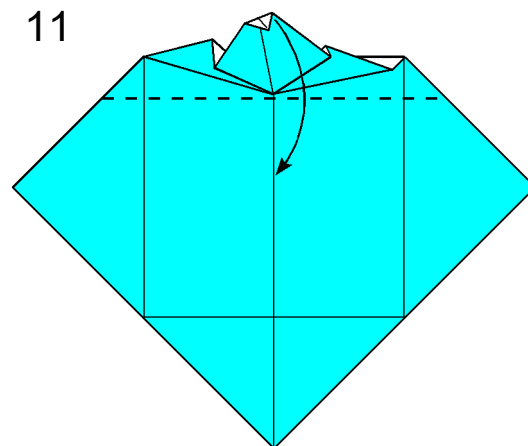
8. Open out the fold made in step 7.



9. Make folds a and b using the existing creases then complete fold c by flattening the resulting flap asymmetrically.

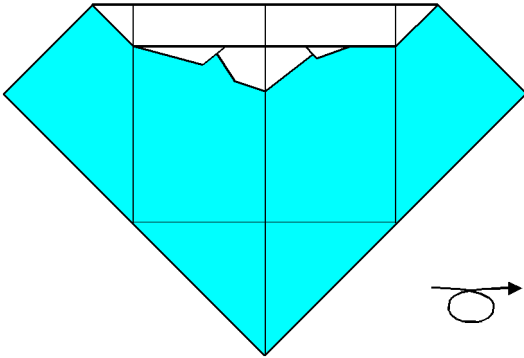


10. Your design should now look like this. Fold the tip of the top point downwards.



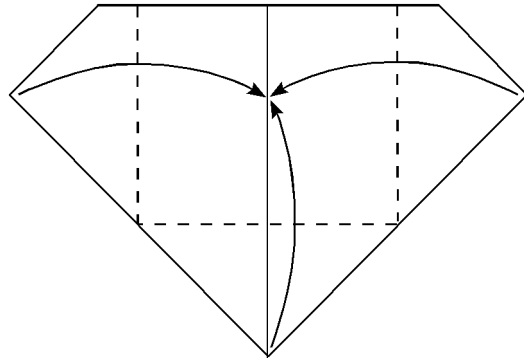
11. Fold the top downwards as shown.

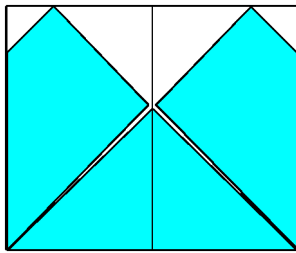
12. This is the result. Turn over sideways.

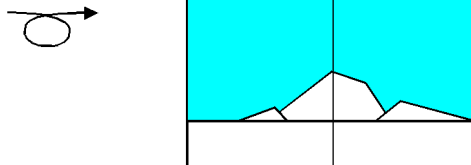
13. Fold the three remaining flaps into the centre by reversing the direction of the existing creases.

14. Turn over forwards.

15. South is finished. The proportions of this design can be varied by omitting step 2 and varying the position of the fold made in step 3.
