

# Waiting for the Ferry

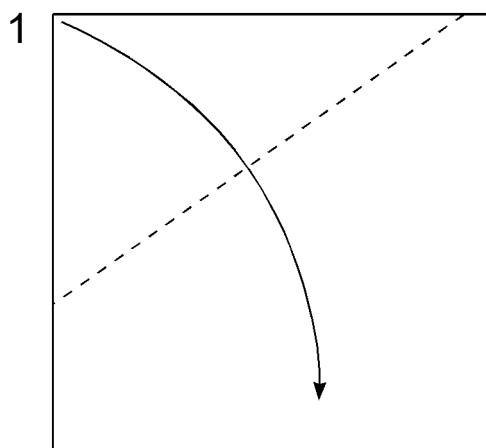

Waiting for the Ferry is a one fold design, one of only four I have managed to conceive of in many years of trying.

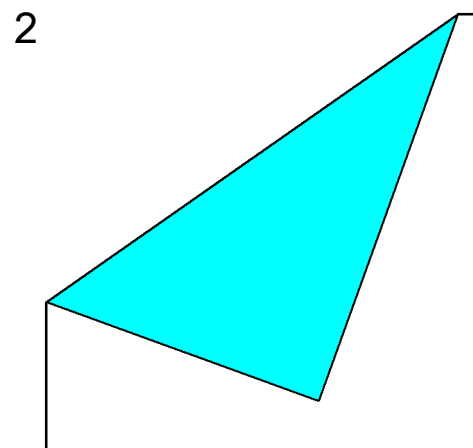
The test for a good minimalist design is whether other people can recognise what it is meant to be without being told. Sadly, so far, nobody has got this one without a little hint.

This was invented while waiting for a ferry on a Greek island in the Summer of 1999. Unfortunately I cannot now remember which island it was ...

You will need a single square of blue/white irogami. Begin with your paper arranged white side up.

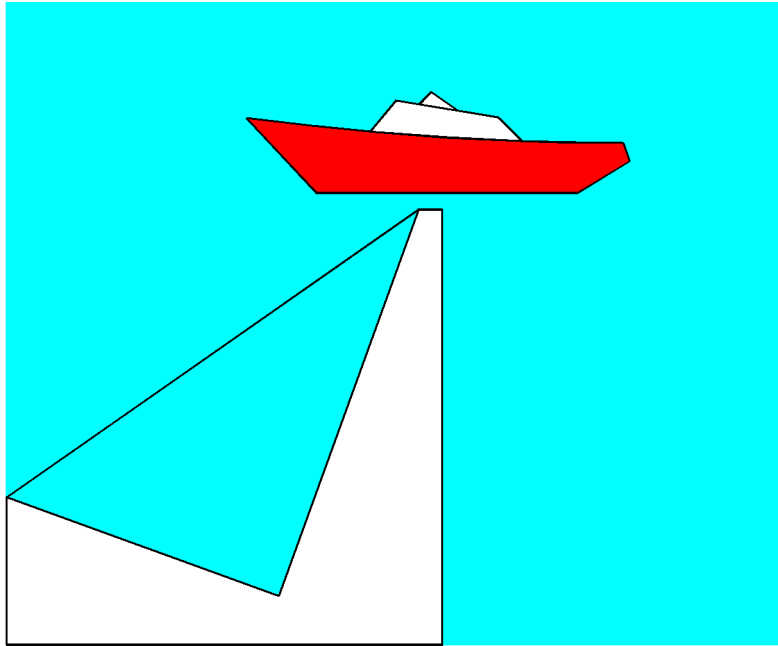


1. Fold the top left hand corner diagonally inwards. Try to make your paper look as much like picture 2 as possible.
